

### INTERPRETATION AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

### **Defined terms**

1.—(1) In these articles. Unless the context requires otherwise -

### **Directors' General Authority**

• Subject to the articles, the directors are responsible for the management of the company's business, for which purpose they may exercise all the powers of the company

### Shareholders' Reserve Power

- —(1) The shareholders may, by special resolution, direct the directors to take, or refrain from taking, specified action.
- (2) No such special resolution invalidates anything which the directors have done before the passing of the resolution.

### **Directors May Delegate**

- (1) Subject to the articles, the directors may delegate any of the powers which are conferred on them under the articles

- (1) The general rule about decision-making by directors is that any decision of the directors must be either a majority decision at a meeting or a decision taken in accordance with article 8. (2) If
  - a. the company only has one director, and
  - b. no provision of the articles requires it to have more than one director, the general rule does not apply, and the director may take decisions without regard to any of the provisions of the articles relating to directors' decision-making.

### **Unanimous Decisions**

- (1) A decision of the directors is taken in accordance with this article when all eligible directors indicate to each other by any means that they share a common view on a matter.
- (2) Such a decision may take the form of a resolution in writing, copies of which have been signed by each eligible director or to which each eligible director has otherwise indicated agreement in writing.
- (3) References in this article to eligible directors are to directors who would have been entitled to vote on the matter had it been proposed as a resolution at a directors' meeting.
- (4) A decision may not be taken in accordance with this article if the eligible directors would not have formed a quorum at such a meeting.

### Calling A Directors' Meeting

- (1) Any director may call a directors' meeting by giving notice of the meeting to the directors or by authorising the company secretary (if any) to give such notice.
- (2) Notice of any directors' meeting must indicate
  - a. its proposed date and time;
  - b. where it is to take place; and
  - c. if it is anticipated that directors participating in the meeting will not be in the same place, how it is proposed that they should communicate with each other during the meeting.
- (3) Notice of a directors' meeting must be given to each director.

### **Participation in Directors' Meetings**

(3) If all the directors participating in a meeting are not in the same place, they may decide that the meeting is to be treated as taking place wherever any of them is.

### **Quorum for Directors' Meetings**

- (1) At a directors' meeting, unless a quorum is participating, no proposal is to be voted on, except a proposal to call another meeting.
- (2) The quorum for directors' meetings the quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of directors are two where there are not more than six directors, but where there are more than six directors, the quorum is one-third of the number of directors, and where the number of directors is not a multiple of three, then the quorum one third to the nearest number.
- (3) If the total number of directors for the time being is less than the quorum required, the directors must not take any decision other than a decision
  - a. to appoint further directors, or
  - b. to call a general meeting so as to enable the shareholders to appoint further directors.

### **Chairing Directors' Meetings**

- (2) But if paragraph (3) applies, a director who is interested in an actual or proposed transaction or arrangement with the company is to be counted as participating in a decision at a directors' meeting, or part of a directors' meeting, relating to it for quorum and voting purposes.

a. the company by ordinary resolution disapplies the provision of the articles which would otherwise prevent a director from being counted as participating in the decision-making process;

- b. the director's interest cannot reasonably be regarded as likely to give rise to a conflict of interest; or c. the director's conflict of interest arises from a permitted cause.
- (4) For the purposes of this article, the following are permitted causes
  - a. a guarantee given, or to be given, by or to a director in respect of an obligation incurred by or on behalf of the company or any of its subsidiaries;
  - b. subscription, or an agreement to subscribe, for shares or other securities of the company or any of its subsidiaries, or to underwrite, sub-underwrite, or guarantee subscription for any such shares or securities;

(1) The company must issue each shareholder, free of charge, with one or more certificates in respect of the shares which that shareholder holds.

- (2) Every certificate must specify
  - a. in respect of how many shares, of what class, it is issued;
  - b. the nominal value of those shares;
  - c. that the shares are fully paid; and
  - d. any distinguishing numbers assigned to them.
- (3) No certificate may be issued in respect of shares of more than one class.
- (4) If more than one person holds a share, only one certificate may be issued in respect of it.
- (5) Certificates must
  - a. have affixed to them the company's common seal, or
  - b. be otherwise executed as a deed.

### **Replacement Share Certificates**

- (1) If a certificate issued in respect of a shareholder's shares is
  - a. damaged or defaced, or
  - b. said to be lost, stolen or destroyed,

that shareholder is entitled to be issued with a replacement certificate in respect of the same shares.

- (2) A shareholder exercising the right to be issued with such a replacement certificate
  - a. may at the same time exercise the right to be issued with a single certificate or separate certificates;
  - b. must return the certificate which is to be replaced to the company if it is damaged or defaced; and
  - c. must comply with such conditions as to evidence, indemnity and the payment of a reasonable fee as the directors decide.

### **Share Transfers**

- (1) Shares may be transferred by means of an instrument of transfer in any usual form or any other form approved by the directors, which is executed by or on behalf of the transferor.
- (2) No fee may be charged for registering any instrument of transfer or other document relating to or affecting the title to any share.
- (3) The company may retain any instrument of transfer which is registered.
- (4) The transferor remains the holder of a share until the transferee's name is entered in the register of members as holder of it.
- (5) The directors may refuse to register the transfer of a share, and if they do so, the instrument of transfer must be returned to the transferee with the notice of refusal unless they suspect that the proposed transfer may be fraudulent.

- (1) If title to a share passes to a transmittee, the company may only recognise the transmittee as having any title to that share.
- (2) A transmittee who produces such evidence of entitlement to shares as the directors may properly require
  - a. may, subject to the articles, choose either to become the holder of those shares or to have them transferred to another person, and
  - b. subject to the articles, and pending any transfer of the shares to another person, has the same rights as the holder had.
- (3) But transmittees do not have the right to attend or vote at a general meeting, or agree to a proposed written resolution, in respect of shares to which they are entitled, by reason of the holder's death or bankruptcy or otherwise, unless they become the holders of those shares.

### **Exercise of Transmittees' Rights**

- (1) Transmittees who wish to become the holders of shares to which they have become entitled must notify the company in writing of that wish.
- (2) If the transmittee wishes to have a share transferred to another person, the transmittee must execute an instrument of transfer in respect of it.
- (3) Any transfer made or executed under this article is to be treated as if it were made or executed by the person from whom the transmittee has derived rights in respect of the share, and as if the event which gave rise to the transmission had not occurred.

### **Transmittees Bound by Prior Notices**

• If a notice is given to a shareholder in respect of shares and a transmittee is entitled to those shares, the transmittee is bound by the notice if it was given to the shareholder before the transmittee's name has been entered in the register of members.

### SHARES AND DISTRIBUTIONS

### Company's lien over partly paid shares

- (1) The company has a lien ("the company's lien") over every share which is partly paid for any part of
  - a. that share's nominal value, and
  - b. any premium at which it was issued,

which has not been paid to the company, and which is payable immediately or at some time in the future, whether or not a call notice has been sent in respect of it.

- (2) The company's lien over a share
  - a. takes priority over any third party's interest in that share, and

- b. extends to any dividend or other money payable by the company in respect of that share and (if the lien is enforced and the share is sold by the company) the proceeds of sale of that share.
- (3) The directors may at any time decide that a share which is or would otherwise be subject to the company's lien shall not be subject to it, either wholly or in part.

### Enforcement of the company's lien

- (1) Subject to the provisions of this article, if
  - a. a lien enforcement notice has been given in respect of a share, and
  - b. the person to whom the notice was given has failed to comply with it, the company may sell that share in such manner as the directors decide.
- (2) A lien enforcement notice
  - a. may only be given in respect of a share which is subject to the company's lien, in respect of which a sum is payable and the due date for payment of that sum has passed;
  - b. must specify the share concerned;
  - c. must require payment of the sum payable within 14 days of the notice;

- (3) Where shares are sold under this article
  - a. the directors may authorise any person to execute an instrument of transfer of the shares to the purchaser or a person nominated by the purchaser, and
  - b. the transferee is not bound to see to the application of the consideration, and the transferee's title is not affected by any irregularity in or invalidity of the process leading to the sale.
- (4) The net proceeds of any such sale (after payment of the costs of sale and any other costs of enforcing the lien) must be applied
  - a. first, in payment of so much of the sum for which the lien exists as was payable at the date of the lien enforcement notice.
  - b. second, to the person entitled to the shares at the date of the sale, but only after the certificate for the shares sold has been surrendered to the company for cancellation or a suitable indemnity has been given for any lost certificates, and subject to a lien equivalent to the company's lien over the shares before the sale for any money payable in respect of the shares after the date of the lien enforcement notice.
- (5) A statutory declaration by a director or the company secretary that the declarant is a director or the company secretary and that a share has been sold to satisfy the company's lien on a specified date—

a. is conclusive evidence of the facts stated in it as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the share,

b. subject to compliance with any other formalities of transfer required by the articles or by law, constitutes a good title to the share.

### Call notices

- (1) Subject to the articles and the terms on which shares are allotted, the directors may send a notice (a "call notice") to a member requiring the member to pay the company a specified sum of money (a "call") which is payable in respect of shares which that member holds at the date when the directors decide to send the call notice.
- (2) A call notice
  - a. may not require a member to pay a call which exceeds the total sum unpaid on that member's shares (whether as to the share's nominal value or any amount payable to the company by way of premium);
  - b. must state when and how any call to which it relates it is to be paid; and
  - c. may permit or require the call to be paid by instalments.
- (3) A member must comply with the requirements of a call notice, but no member is obliged to pay any call before 14 days have passed since the notice was sent.
- (4) Before the company has received any call due under a call notice the directors may
  - a. revoke it wholly or in part, or
  - b. specify a later time for payment than is specified in the notice, by a further notice in writing to the member in respect of whose shares the call is made.

### Liability to pay calls

- (1) Liability to pay a call is not extinguished or transferred by transferring the shares in respect of which it is required to be paid.
- (2) Joint holders of a share are jointly and severally liable to pay all calls in respect of that share.
- (3) Subject to the terms on which shares are allotted, the directors may, when issuing shares, provide that call notices sent to the holders of those shares may require them
  - a. to pay calls which are not the same, or
  - b. to pay calls at different times.

### When call notice need not be issued

- (1) A call notice need not be issued in respect of sums which are specified, in the terms on which a share is issued, as being payable to the company in respect of that share (whether in respect of nominal value or premium)
  - a. on allotment:
  - b. on the occurrence of a particular event; or
  - c. on a date fixed by or in accordance with the terms of issue.

(2) But if the due date for payment of such a sum has passed and it has not been paid, the holder of the share concerned is treated in all respects as having failed to comply with a call notice in respect of that sum, and is liable to the same consequences as regards the payment of interest and forfeiture.

### Failure to comply with call notice: automatic consequences

- (1) If a person is liable to pay a call and fails to do so by the call payment date
  - a. the directors may issue a notice of intended forfeiture to that person, and
  - b. until the call is paid, that person must pay the company interest on the call from the call payment date at the relevant rate.
- (2) For the purposes of this article
  - a. the "call payment date" is the time when the call notice states that a call is payable, unless the directors give a notice specifying a later date, in which case the "call payment date" is that later date;
  - b. the "relevant rate" is
    - i. the rate fixed by the terms on which the share in respect of which the call is due was allotted;
    - ii. such other rate as was fixed in the call notice which required payment of the call, or has otherwise been determined by the directors; or
    - iii. if no rate is fixed in either of these ways, the prevailing interest rate as set by the Monetary Policy Committee of the Central Bank of Nigeria.
- (3) The directors may waive any obligation to pay interest on a call wholly or in part.

### Notice of intended forfeiture

- A notice of intended forfeiture
  - a. may be sent in respect of any share in respect of which a call has not been paid as required by a call notice;
  - b. must be sent to the holder of that share or to a person entitled to it by reason of the holder's death, bankruptcy or otherwise;
  - c. must require payment of the call and any accrued interest by a date which is not less than 14 days after the date of the notice;
  - d. must state how the payment is to be made; and
  - e. must state that if the notice is not complied with, the shares in respect of which the call is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

### Directors' power to forfeit shares

If a notice of intended forfeiture is not complied with before the date by which payment of the call is required in the notice of intended forfeiture, the directors may decide that any share in respect of which it was

given is forfeited, and the forfeiture is to include all dividends or other moneys payable in respect of the forfeited shares and not paid before the forfeiture.

### Effect of forfeiture

- (1) Subject to the articles, the forfeiture of a share extinguishes
  - a. all interests in that share, and all claims and demands against the company in respect of it, and
  - b. all other rights and liabilities incidental to the share as between the person whose share it was prior to the forfeiture and the company.
- (2) Any share which is forfeited in accordance with the articles
  - a. is deemed to have been forfeited when the directors decide that it is forfeited;
  - b. is deemed to be the property of the company; and
  - c. may be sold, re-allotted or otherwise disposed of as the directors think fit.
- (3) If a person's shares have been forfeited
  - a. the company must send that person notice that forfeiture has occurred and record it in the register of members;
  - b. that person ceases to be a member in respect of those shares;
  - c. that person must surrender the certificate for the shares forfeited to the company for cancellation;
  - d. that person remains liable to the company for all sums payable by that person under the articles at the date of forfeiture in respect of those shares provided that his liability ceases when the company receives payment in full of all money in respect of the shares; and
  - e. the directors may waive payment of such sums wholly or in part or enforce payment without any allowance for the value of the shares at the time of forfeiture or for any consideration received on their disposal.
- (4) At any time before the company disposes of a forfeited share, the directors may decide to cancel the forfeiture on payment of all calls and interest due in respect of it and on such other terms as they think fit.

### **Procedure following forfeiture**

- (1) If a forfeited share is to be disposed of by being transferred, the company may receive the consideration for the transfer and the directors may authorise any person to execute the instrument of transfer.
- (2) A statutory declaration by a director or the company secretary that the declarant is a director or the company secretary and that a share has been forfeited on a specified date
  - a. is conclusive evidence of the facts stated in it as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the share,

- (3) A person to whom a forfeited share is transferred is not bound to see to the application of the consideration (if any) nor is that person's title to the share affected by any irregularity in or invalidity of the process leading to the forfeiture or transfer of the share.
- (4) If the company sells a forfeited share, the person who held it prior to its forfeiture is entitled to receive from the company the proceeds of such sale, net of any commission, and excluding any amount which
  - a. was, or would have become, payable, and
  - b. had not, when that share was forfeited, been paid by that person in respect of that share,

but no interest is payable to such a person in respect of such proceeds and the company is not required to account for any money earned on them.

### Surrender of shares

- (1) A member may surrender any share to the company as a gift
- (2) The directors may accept the surrender of any such share.
- (3) The effect of surrender on a share is the same as the effect of forfeiture on that share.
- (4) A share which has been surrendered may be dealt with in the same way as a share which has been forfeited.

### SHARES AND DISTRIBUTIONS

### **Procedure for Declaring Dividends**

- (1) The company may by ordinary resolution declare dividends, and the directors may decide to pay interim dividends.
- (2) A dividend must not be declared unless the directors have made a recommendation as to its amount. Such a dividend must not exceed the amount recommended by the directors.
- (3) No dividend may be declared or paid unless it is in accordance with shareholders' respective rights.
- (4) Unless the shareholders' resolution to declare or directors' decision to pay a dividend, or the terms on which shares are issued, specify otherwise, it must be paid by reference to each shareholder's holding of shares on the date of the resolution or decision to declare or pay it.
- (5) If the company's share capital is divided into different classes, no interim dividend may be paid on shares carrying deferred or non-preferred rights if, at the time of payment, any preferential dividend is in arrear.
- (6) The directors may pay at intervals any dividend payable at a fixed rate if it appears to them that the profits available for distribution justify the payment. (7) If the directors act in good faith, they do not incur any liability to the holders of shares conferring preferred rights for any loss they may suffer by the lawful payment of an interim dividend on shares with deferred or non-preferred rights.

### Payment of Dividends and Other Distributions

• (1) Where a dividend or other sum which is a distribution is payable in respect of a share, it must be paid by one or more of the following means-

- a. transfer to a bank specified by the distribution recipient either in writing or as the directors may otherwise decide;
- b. sending a cheque made payable to the distribution recipient by post to the distribution recipient at the distribution recipient's registered address (if the distribution recipient is a holder of the share), or (in any other case) to an address specified by the distribution recipient either in writing or as the directors may otherwise decide;
- c. sending a cheque made payable to such person by post to such person at such address as the distribution recipient has specified either in writing or as the directors may otherwise decide; or
- d. any other means of payment as the directors agree with the distribution recipient either in writing or by such other means as the directors decide.
- (2) In the articles, "the distribution recipient" means, in respect of a share in respect of which a dividend or other sum is payable
  - a. the holder of the share; or
  - b. if the share has two or more joint holders, whichever of them is named first in the register of members; or
  - c. if the holder is no longer entitled to the share by reason of death or bankruptcy, or otherwise by operation of law, the transmittee.

### No Interest on Distributions

- The company may not pay interest on any dividend or other sum payable in respect of a share unless otherwise provided by
  - a. the terms on which the share was issued, or
  - b. the provisions of another agreement between the holder of that share and the company.

### **Unclaimed Distributions**

- (1) All dividends or other sums which are
  - a. payable in respect of shares, and
  - b. unclaimed after having been declared or become payable,

may be invested or otherwise made use of by the directors for the benefit of the company in accordance with the provisions of section 429 of the Act.

(2) The payment of any such dividend or other sum into a separate account does not make the company a trustee in respect of it.

(3) If—

a. twelve years have passed from the date on which a dividend or other sum became due for payment, and b. the distribution recipient has not claimed it,

the distribution recipient is no longer entitled to that dividend or other sum and it ceases to remain owing by the company and should be included in the report that should be submitted to the other shareholders of the

### **Non-Cash Distributions**

Subject to the terms of issue of the share in question, the company may, by ordinary resolution on the recommendation of the directors, decide to pay all or part of a dividend or other distribution payable in respect of a share by transferring non-cash assets of equivalent value (including, without limitation, shares or other securities in any company).

### Waiver of Distributions

- Distribution recipients may waive their entitlement to a dividend or other distribution payable in respect of a share by giving the company notice in writing to that effect, but if
  - a. the share has more than one holder, or
  - b. more than one person is entitled to the share, whether by reason of the death or bankruptcy of one or more joint holders, or otherwise,

the notice is not effective unless it is expressed to be given, and signed, by all the holders or persons otherwise entiled to the share.

### SHARES AND DISTRIBUTIONS

### **Authority to Capitalise and Appropriation of Capitalised Sums**

- (1) Subject to the articles, the directors may, if they are so authorised by an ordinary resolution
  - a. decide to capitalise any profits of the company (whether or not they are available for distribution) which are not required for paying a preferential dividend, or any sum standing to the credit of the company's share premium account or capital redemption reserve; and
  - b. appropriate any sum which they so decide to capitalise (a "capitalised sum") to the persons who would have been entitled to it if it were distributed by way of dividend (the "persons entitled") and in the same proportions.
- (2) Capitalised sums must be applied
  - a. on behalf of the persons entitled, and
  - b. in the same proportions as a dividend would have been distributed to them.
- (3) Any capitalised sum may be applied in paying up new shares of a nominal amount equal to the capitalised sum which are then allotted credited as fully paid to the persons entitled or as they may direct.
- (4) A capitalised sum which was appropriated from profits available for distribution may be applied in paying up new debentures of the company which are then allotted credited as fully paid to the persons entitled or as

they may direct.

- (5) Subject to the articles the directors may
  - a. apply capitalised sums in accordance with paragraphs (3) and (4) partly in one way and partly in another;
  - b. make such arrangements as they think fit to deal with shares or debentures becoming distributable in fractions under this article (including the issuing of fractional certificates or the making of cash payments); and
  - c. authorise any person to enter into an agreement with the company on behalf of all the persons entitled which is binding on them in respect of the allotment of shares and debentures to them under this article.

### DECISION-MAKING BY SHAREHOLDERS

### **Attendance and Speaking at General Meetings**

- (1) A person is able to exercise the right to speak at a general meeting when that person is in a position to communicate to all those attending the meeting, during the meeting, any information or opinions which that person has on the business of the meeting.
- (2) A person is able to exercise the right to vote at a general meeting when
  - a. that person is able to vote, during the meeting, on resolutions put to the vote at the meeting, and
  - b. that person's vote can be taken into account in determining whether or not such resolutions are passed at the same time as the votes of all the other persons attending the meeting.
- (3) The directors may make whatever arrangements they consider appropriate to enable those attending a general meeting to exercise their rights to speak or vote at it.
- (4) In determining attendance at a general meeting, it is immaterial whether any two or more members attending it are in the same place as each other.
- (5) Two or more persons who are not in the same place as each other attend a general meeting if their circumstances are such that if they have (or were to have) rights to speak and vote at that meeting, they are (or would be) able to exercise them.

### **Chairing General Meetings**

- (1) If the directors have appointed a chairman, the chairman shall chair general meetings if present and willing to do so.
- (2) If the directors have not appointed a chairman, or if the chairman is unwilling to chair the meeting or is not present within five minutes of the time at which a meeting was due to start
  - a. the directors present, or
  - b. (if no directors are present), the meeting, must appoint a director or shareholder to chair the meeting, and the appointment of the chairman of the meeting must be the first business of the meeting
  - c. The person chairing a meeting in accordance with this article is referred to as "the chairman of the meeting".

### Attendance and Speaking by Directors and Non-Shareholders

- (1) Directors may attend and speak at general meetings, whether or not they are shareholders.
- (2) The chairman of the meeting may permit other persons who are not
  - a. shareholders of the company, or
  - b. otherwise entitled to exercise the rights of shareholders in relation to general meetings, to attend and speak at a general meeting.

### Adjournment

- (1) If the persons attending a general meeting within one hour of the time at which the meeting was due to start do not constitute a quorum, or if during a meeting a quorum ceases to be present, the chairman of the meeting must adjourn it.
- (2) The chairman of the meeting may adjourn a general meeting at which a quorum is present if
  - a. the meeting consents to an adjournment, or
  - b. it appears to the chairman of the meeting that an adjournment is necessary to protect the safety of any person attending the meeting or ensure that the business of the meeting is conducted in an orderly manner.
- (3) The chairman of the meeting must adjourn a general meeting if directed to do so by the meeting.
- (4) When adjourning a general meeting, the chairman of the meeting must
  - a. either specify the time and place to which it is adjourned or state that it is to continue at a time and place to be fixed by the directors, and
  - b. have regard to any directions as to the time and place of any adjournment which have been given by the meeting.
- (5) If the continuation of an adjourned meeting is to take place more than 30 days after it was adjourned, notice of the adjourned meeting and the business to be transacted shall be given as in the case of the original meeting. (6) No business may be transacted at an adjourned general meeting which could not properly have been transacted at the meeting if the adjournment had not taken place.

### DECISION-MAKING BY SHAREHOLDERS

### **Voting: General**

A resolution put to the vote of a general meeting must be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is duly demanded in accordance with the articles provided that in the case of an electronic meeting, voting may be done electronically or by count of voice concurrence.

- (1) No objection may be raised to the qualification of any person voting at a general meeting except at the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote objected to is tendered, and every vote not disallowed at the meeting is valid.
- (2) Any such objection must be referred to the chairman of the meeting, whose decision is final.

### **Poll Votes**

- (1) A poll on a resolution may be demanded—
- a. in advance of the general meeting where it is to be put to the vote, or
- b. at a general meeting, either before a show of hands on that resolution or immediately after the result of a show of hands on that resolution is declared.
- (2) A poll may be demanded by
  - a. the chairman of the meeting where he is a member or a proxy;
  - b. at least three members present in person or by proxy;
  - c. any member or members present in person or by proxy and representing at least one tenth of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at the meeting;
  - d. any member or members in the company conferring a right to vote at the meeting having shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to at least one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all the shares conferring that right.
- (3) A demand for a poll may be withdrawn if
  - a. the poll has not yet been taken, and
  - b. the chairman of the meeting consents to the withdrawal.
- (4) Polls must be taken immediately and in such manner as the chairman of the meeting directs.

### **Content of Proxy Notices**

- (1) Proxies may only validly be appointed by a notice in writing (a "proxy notice") which—
- a. states the name and address of the shareholder appointing the proxy;
- b. identifies the person appointed to be that shareholder's proxy and the general meeting in relation to which that person is appointed;
- c. is signed by or on behalf of the shareholder appointing the proxy, or is authenticated in such manner as the directors may determine; and
- d. is delivered to the company in accordance with the articles and any instructions contained in the notice of the general meeting to which they relate.
- (2) The company may require proxy notices to be delivered in a particular form, and may specify different forms for different purposes.

- (4) Unless a proxy notice indicates otherwise, it must be treated as
  - a. allowing the person appointed under it as a proxy discretion as to how to vote on any ancillary or procedural resolutions put to the meeting, and
  - b. appointing that person as a proxy in relation to any adjournment of the general meeting to which it relates as well as the meeting itself.

### **Delivery of Proxy Notices**

- (1) A person who is entitled to attend, speak or vote (either on a show of hands or on a poll) at a general meeting remains so entitled in respect of that meeting or any adjournment of it, even though a valid proxy notice has been delivered to the company by or on behalf of that person.
- (2) An appointment under a proxy notice may be revoked by delivering to the company a notice in writing given by or on behalf of the person by whom or on whose behalf the proxy notice was given.
- (3) A notice revoking a proxy appointment only takes effect if it is delivered before the start of the meeting or adjourned meeting to which it relates.
- (4) If a proxy notice is not executed by the person appointing the proxy, it must be accompanied by written evidence of the authority of the person who executed it to execute it on the appointor's behalf.

### **Amendments to Resolutions**

- (1) An ordinary resolution to be proposed at a general meeting may be amended by ordinary resolution if
  - a. notice of the proposed amendment is given to the company in writing by a person entitled to vote at the general meeting at which it is to be proposed not less than 48 hours before the meeting is to take place (or such later time as the chairman of the meeting may determine), and
  - b. the proposed amendment does not, in the reasonable opinion of the chairman of the meeting, materially alter the scope of the resolution.
- (2) A special resolution to be proposed at a general meeting may be amended by ordinary resolution, if
  - a. the chairman of the meeting proposes the amendment at the general meeting at which the resolution is to be proposed, and
  - b. the amendment does not go beyond what is necessary to correct a grammatical or other non-substantive error in the resolution.
- (3) If the chairman of the meeting, acting in good faith, wrongly decides that an amendment to a resolution is out of order, the chairman's error does not invalidate the vote on that resolution.

- (1) Subject to the articles, anything sent or supplied by or to the company under the articles may be sent or supplied in any way in which the CAMA, 2020 provides for documents or information which are authorised or required by any provision of that Act to be sent or supplied by or to the company.

Effective control of construction operation instills pride in work, gains favourable recognition, and save time and money. We know both **EVERGREEN HOME BUILDERS & LOGISTICS LIMITED** and the clients are interested in quality construction simply because it means to the Clients – getting our money's worth, and to satisfactory performance and profit. **CQC** is a management system that produces construction that complies with the terms of the contract. It encourages all phases of the work, such as approval of submittals, procurement, storage of material and equipment, coordination of subcontractor's activities, and the inspections and tests required to be sure that specified materials are used and installation is acceptable to produce the required end product.

For the **CQC** to be effective there must be a planned program of action and lines of authority and responsibilities must be established. We designate a Quality Control manager who will report directly to the Project Director with a direct responsibility to the clients to oversee and mange the project's quality. The Quality Control Manager will have complete authority to stop any non-conforming work.

Effective communication is essential to successful executions of the CQC plan. The effectiveness of communication depends on the quality and quantity of its presentation. It is necessary to analyze, develop, and document how the QC Manager will manage and control all construction operations. The plan will be geared to fit the needs of the Block "T" and the construction TEAM. A meeting will be scheduled before start of construction, between us and Clients to discuss and review the QC Plan and our interrelationship with the Clients. TQC Plan will include at least the following key considerations:



- Include a system for tracking construction deficiencies to ensure corrective action is taken in a timely manner;
- Demonstrate adequate size an technical capabilities to timely accomplish all quality control functions;
- Organizational lines of authority and responsibility will be clear and logical;
- Explain the control, inspection, and test procedures, both on-site and off – site;
- Procedures for processing submittals and who is responsible for approving each submittals;
- Demonstrate coverage of testing is adequate.

Strongly emphasize that quality will be obtained through a preventive type of control of each definable feature and list of the proposed definable features of work

To ensure quality the three-phase control concept will be implemented. The quality control will be divided into three phases for all definable features of work. A definable feature is a task, which is separate and district from other tasks and has separate control requirements. Each control phase provides the opportunity to prevent problems and deficiencies. The three phases provides the opportunity to prevent problems and deficiencies. The three phases are:

**Initial Inspection:** As soon as a representative portion of feature of work has been completed is the best opportunity to get the work off to a proper start in full compliance with contact requirements. This is the time for the contractor to establish standards of workmanship. If there are differences of option in the interpretation of the contract requirements, the issue can be discussed and settled at the outset of work much easier than after work is in place. The initial inspection phase is a practical method of performing preventive inspection and reaching agreements in advance.

Follow-up inspections and testing is geared toward a level of effort to determine continuation of compliance and workmanship established during preparatory and initial phases Follow – up inspections and testing may be on a daily, routine, or predetermined basis as required to assure strict contract compliance. Follow-up inspections procedures will include control testing and visual inspection become more the Quality Control Manager, independent inspection and testing firms as required, and other team members designated for quality control.

### **Policy for Reporting Quality Control Findings**

A cumulative list of jobs site deficiencies will be generated during construction. This includes items identified by QA personnel, QC staff, testing failures, etc. this will be continually maintained with dates of corrective actions. The list intended as an inspection system whereby all discrepancies in quality, workmanship, materials, equipment, supplies, and/or unauthorized deviations from the specifications can be tracked, so corrective action can be taken in a timely manner. The Corp of Engineers will get copies of the list as deficiencies occur. Subcontractors will be notified of any deficiency and given a date the corrective action needs to be completed. Upon completion of the deficiency the Clients will be asked to inspect the corrective action taken and assure that all deficient items are corrected as required by the Contract Requirements.
